Commercial Rehabilitation Loan Program:

Inception: 2010

Clients served: Approximately 49

Total dollars spent: Approximately \$1,241,609.00

Eligible uses: The goal of the Commercial Rehabilitation Loan Program (CRLP) was to help eliminate economic and physical blight of commercial properties within the unincorporated areas of Sonoma County, with special incentives to business and commercial property owners to rehabilitate, renovate and revitalize commercial properties.

Current status: Inactive but still servicing previous CRLP loans.

Housing Rehabilitation Loan Program:

Inception: 1979

Clients served: Approximately 329

Total dollars spent: Approximately \$8,554,000.00

Eligible uses: The purpose of the Housing Rehabilitation Loan Program (HRLP) is to provide decent, safe and sanitary housing for low-income residents of Sonoma County through the correction of actual or potential problems in existing structures.

Current status: The HRLP program is currently active.

Flood Elevation Program:

Inception: 1997

Clients served: Approximately 305 homes elevated.

Total dollars spent: Approximately \$27,593,818.00

Eligible uses: Flood hazard mitigation; protecting the community from the flood hazard through elevating residential buildings so that the lowest floor of the living space is two feet above the 100 year flood level.

Current status: Active with expected continuation of program for 10-15 years or until all eligible properties are protected from the flood hazard.

Earthquake Resistant Bracing System Program:

Inception: 1993

Clients served: 1619

Total dollars spent: \$4,203,144.00

Eligible uses: Installing earthquake resistant bracing systems and strapping water heaters in mobile homes in the Urban County to protect from the seismic threat and fire caused by water heaters being displaced by the shaking.

Current status: Program is currently active with expected continuation of Program until all mobile homes are protected.

Septic Program

Inception: 1983

Clients served: 257 (167 from 1999 on)

Total dollars spent: \$618,239 spent since 1999.

Current status: Currently this program is not active; however, there has been some preliminary work to reinstate the program.
